

## Distance Learning and Telemedicine Grants FY 2023 Congressionally Directed Spending

| IL     | OSF Healthcare System dba Saint Anthony Medical Center          | \$218,000          | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip two hub sites and one non-fixed end-user site in north central Illinois. Medical Professionals at OSF Healthcare System dba Saint Anthony Medical Center in Winnebago and Peoria Illinois will provide hospital-level care to patients located within thirty minutes of the two hub sites. This project will benefit 50 communities within Stephenson, Winnebago, Ogle, Boone, Dekalb, McHenry, Peoria, Stark, Tazewell, Woodford, Fulton and Mason counties. The total population of the communities impacted is more than 272,000. |
| IL     | Carle Eureka Hospital   | \$163,000          | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip one hub/end-user site and three end-user sites in Woodford County in central Illinois with telehealth equipment. Medical professionals at Carle Eureka Hospital in Eureka, Illinois will deliver specialty and critical health care services to individuals at three rural clinics benefitting an estimated 10,011 rural residents.  |
| IL, MO | Blessing Hospital   | \$710,000          | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip a mobile unit with telehealth and diagnostic equipment. The mobile unit will initially serve rural residents in Adams, Pike, Brown, Scott and Hancock counties in Illinois and Marion county in Missouri. This mobile unit will be supported by six hub sites from Blessing Hospital, Illini Hospital, and Springfield Maternal Fetal Medicine. Once fully established the mobile unit will support all of the Blessing Health System serving areas in Illinois and Missouri benefitting approximately 200,247 individuals.          |
| LA     | Acadiana Planning Commission, Inc.                              | \$400,000          | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip two hub/end-user sites and 15 end-user sites throughout Evangeline Parish in Central Louisiana with mobile telehealth carts. Medical professionals at Public Parish Health Unit in Evangeline Parish will deliver primary medical care and mental health services to 16 locations benefitting 33,500 residents.  |
| MS     | Simpson Community Healthcare, Inc. dba Simpson General Hospital | \$1,000,000        | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip four hub sites and one hub/end-user site throughout Simpson and Rankin counties in southcentral Mississippi with telemedicine devices. Medical professionals at Simpson Community Healthcare Inc. dba Simpson General Hospital in Simpson County, Mississippi will deliver medical care, mental health care and substance abuse treatment at locations potentially benefitting 25,950 people.  |
| MS     | Magee Benevolent Association Inc dba Magee General Hospital     | \$1,000,000        | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip one hub/end-user site and 13 end-user sites throughout Simpson and Smith County in southcentral Mississippi with telemedicine devices. Medical professionals at Magee Benevolent Association Inc dba Magee General Hospital in Simpson County, Mississippi will deliver medical care, mental health care and substance abuse treatment at locations potentially benefitting over 27,000 people.  |
| MS     | Covington County Hospital                                       | \$1,000,000        | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip three hub sites and three hub/end user sites throughout Covington County in southcentral Mississippi with telemedicine devices. Medical professionals at Covington County Hospital in Covington County, Mississippi will deliver medical care, mental health care and substance abuse treatment at locations potentially benefitting 19,000 people.  |
| NM     | Western New Mexico University                                   | \$500,000          | This Rural Development investment will be used to equip five hub/end-user sites throughout Grant and McKinley Counties in western New Mexico with distance learning equipment. Training will focus on three primary categories which include: digital storytelling, business analytics and technologies, and online teaching and learning. This project is expected to benefit 1,390 students.   |
