Rural Housing Site Loans

What does this program do?

Rural Housing Site Loans offer two types of loans to help income-eligible applicants buy and develop housing sites:

- Section 523 loans are used to acquire and develop sites only for housing to be built using the Self-Help method. You can learn more about the USDA Rural Development Mutual Self-Help Housing Program at this link: tinyurl.SFHSelfHelp.
- Low- and moderate-income families can use Section 524 Rural Housing Site Loans to acquire and develop rural housing sites with no restrictions regarding the method of construction.

Who can apply?

- Section 523 loans are available to private or public nonprofit organizations that will provide sites solely for Mutual Self-Help housing.
- Section 524 loans are for private or public nonprofit organizations.
 Building sites can be sold to eligible low- and moderate-income families.
- Nonprofits with the legal authority to operate a revolving loan fund
- Nonprofits with the financial, technical, and managerial capacity to comply with relevant federal and state laws
- Federally recognized Tribes as noted by the U.S. Department of the Interior Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA – information at this link: tinyurl.com/BIATribal).

What is an eligible area?

Properties must be located in eligible rural areas. Check the USDA Income and Property Eligibility tool at this link: tinyurl.com/RDEligibility.

What are some of the loan terms?

- Both are 5-year loans
- Section 523 loans: 3 percent interest

 Section 524 loans: Below market rate (established monthly); fixed at closing
