




Rural Development provided financial assistance to the Hualapai Tribe to construct portions of a solar-powered water pipeline system. The line delivers drinking water from the Town of Peach Springs to the top of the Grand Canyon. Residents at Grand Canyon West were required to haul water for many miles along a primitive road to the top of the canyon. The new system fills a storage tank that supplies the residents and the Tribe's commercial tourism ventures. This is another fine example of a self-help project; the Tribe performed the labor, saving thousands of dollars.

Pictured is a small church at the Havasupai Indian Reservation. Rural Development has provided financial assistance for several water projects for this unique Indian community. Many of the Tribe's 600-plus members reside in the Supai Village, at the bottom of the Grand Canyon.


