## USDA AWARDS \$447.5 MILLION IN ELECTRIC LOANS *Nebraska Receives \$15.6 Million*

WASHINGTON, July 30, 2008 —Agriculture Secretary Ed Schafer today announced that 24 rural electric utilities in 20 states have been selected to receive a total of \$447.5 million in loans to build new distribution lines and make system improvements.

“Communities need reliable electric service in rural areas and USDA’s support helps businesses expand and create more economic opportunities,” Schafer said.

Loan funds will be used for a variety of upgrades. These funds will bring electricity to more than 63,561 customers and finance the construction and repair of 6,197 miles of distribution and transmission lines.

The Midwest Electric Cooperative Corporation in Grant, Neb., has been selected to receive \$15,632,000 to serve 593 new consumers, build 174 miles of new and 91 miles of improved distribution line and to make other system improvements. The Trico Electric Power Cooperative in Marana, Ariz., has been selected to receive nearly \$84 million to provide 883 miles of new distribution and transmission lines and make 54 miles of improvements to existing distribution lines. These system improvements will provide service to 14,915 consumers. In Alabama, the Dixie Electric Cooperative in Union Springs, Ala., has been selected to receive \$30.2 million to build 213 miles of new distribution lines and improve 72 miles of existing lines serving approximately 3,376 consumers.

Since 2001, USDA Rural Development has awarded approximately \$28 billion in electric loans to utilities across the nation.

Funding for individual recipients is contingent upon meeting the conditions of the loan agreement. Loans will be made to the following utilities:
