## Town of Burnsville Approved To Receive Community Facilities Grant

**Morgantown, WV – August 16, 2011:** State Director **Bobby Lewis** announces that **USDA Rural Development** approved a Community Facilities Economic Impact Initiative Grant in the amount of \$1,500 for the Town of Burnsville, Braxton County, WV.

Rural Development funds will be used to assist in the purchase of a police cruiser for the Burnsville Police Department.

“Providing funds for such things as police cruisers, ambulances, fire trucks, emergency equipment, etc., is essential for communities in order to provide adequate protection and services to the citizens.”

Rural Development serves as the lead Federal entity for rural development needs and administers program assistance through its housing, business, community and infrastructure programs.
