Central Barbour PSD Approved For Loan and Grant

Morgantown, WV – January 5, 2009: State Director **Rick E. Rice** announces that **Rural Development** approved a Water and Waste Disposal Loan in the amount of \$1,000,000 and Grant of \$700,000 for Central Barbour Public Service District, Barbour County, WV.

Rural Development funds will be used to extend public water service to the Mud Gut Road, Hunters Fork Road, Stringtown Road, Laurel Mountain Road, and Joseph Chapel areas of Barbour County, West Virginia. Construction will involve approximately 54,000 feet of waterline, one water storage tank, and six fire hydrants.

“The project will bring service to approximately 73 rural households who are currently without a safe and reliable source of water,” explained Rice.

Rural Development serves as the lead Federal entity for rural development needs and administers program assistance through its housing, business/cooperative, community and infrastructure programs.
