The "**American Recovery and Reinvestment Act**" (ARRA) was signed by President Barack Obama on February 17, 2009. Nationally, USDA Rural Development has approximately \$21 billion in loan and grant funds to help with economic recovery. The funding expires on September 30, 2010. In this report, we have highlighted the funding provided in FY 2009 with the **ARRA**.
