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**USDA ANNOUNCES APPLICATION TIMEFRAME  
FOR HOUSING PRESERVATION GRANT PROGRAM**

**Lincoln, Neb.**, January 15, 2003 – The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Housing Service published a NOTICE in the December 27, 2002 Federal Register announcing the timeframe and guidelines for applications to be submitted under the Housing Preservation Grant (HPG) program. Potential eligible applicants include qualified state and local governments, private nonprofit corporations, Federally recognized Indian Tribes, or a consortium of eligible entities.

Nebraska has not received a specific allocation of funds for the HPG program this fiscal year. Applications will be selected for funding on a competitive basis, subject to the availability of funds on a nationwide basis. Funding requests from applicants are not to exceed \$50,000. Applicants must submit their application package to the USDA Rural Development State Office by 5 p.m. CST, March 27, 2003.

The HPG program provides funding to selected recipient organizations (grantee) to develop a program that financially assists in the repair and rehabilitation of individual housing, rental properties, or co-ops owned and/or occupied by eligible households. Established income guidelines must be met in order for a household to qualify for the grant funds. The grantee organization administers the funds to provide financial assistance through loans, grants, interest reduction payments, or other comparable financial assistance for necessary repairs and rehabilitation.

Jim Barr, state director for USDA Rural Development in Nebraska stated, “Organizations applying for the program must demonstrate that there is a need for repair and rehabilitation of homes or rental properties in the area to be served. The organization needs to develop an acceptable plan for selecting the individual recipients, assure the quality of work performed, solicit support for the program from the local government(s) in the area to be served, and generate sources of additional funding to supplement the program.”
