Rural Development Partners with State, Local Agencies to Finance Special Needs Housing in Wayne County

COLUMBUS, OHIO, Aug. 24, 2007 – Randall Hunt, state director for USDA Rural Development announced today approval of a \$54,000 loan to Wayne Metropolitan Housing Authority in Wayne, County, Ohio. The funding is from Rural Development's Community Facility Loan and Grant Program and will be used to help purchase an existing home. The home will be used as a group home for mentally handicapped clients of the Wayne County MRDD.

"It's always gratifying to see federal, state and local agencies leveraging financial resources to benefit rural Ohioans with specialized needs," said Hunt. "This cooperative attitude of providing services to Ohioans increases opportunities for those in need across the state."

The Community Facility Program uses grants and loans to help communities develop essential facilities for public use. These facilities include libraries, childcare, hospitals, medical clinics, assisted living facilities, fire and rescue stations, police stations, community centers, public buildings and transportation.
