USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES OPENING OF FAMILY HOUSING COMPLEX

Giddings, Texas, April 30, 2003 – Bryan Daniel, Texas State Director for USDA Rural Development today announced the ribbon cutting for the opening of Windmill Apartments located in Giddings, Lee County, Texas.

The Rural Housing Service, an agency that falls under the USDA Rural Development mission area, administers programs designed to strengthen the economy and infrastructure of rural area. Through its support of the sustainable development of communities, USDA Rural Development works to improve the quality of life in rural America.

“USDA Rural Development is very pleased to be able to provide multi-family housing funding for rural Texans,” said Daniel. “It is our goal to ensure rural residents are afforded an opportunity to live in decent housing that meets basic health and safety standards and provides the benefits of energy efficient features.”

USDA Rural Development funds have been used to construct a 28-unit family apartment in Giddings, Texas. The project will assist in housing eligible applicants in the Lee County area.
