USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR *(Quanah Housing Authority to Receive \$2,334,920 in Loan)*

Quanah, Texas, June 19, 2003 -- Bryan Daniel, Texas State Director, USDA Rural Development announced that the Quanah Housing Authority has received a \$2,334,920 loan through the agency's Community Facilities loan program. The effort is part of USDA Rural Development's national program to help rural areas build and enhance essential community facilities.

"USDA Rural Development's Community Facilities program helps rural communities keep pace with the needs of their rising populations," said Daniel. "Rural residents can utilize our programs to help provide essential public services that will enhance the quality of life for all rural residents."

The funds will be used provide 16-detached two bedroom units for assisted living. Onsite food services will be offered. Medical assistance will be readily available. The project will include a community center, which will have an exercise area and dining area. They already have 20 prospective tenants that have contacted the Housing Authority showing their interest in occupancy. Currently, there are no facilities of this type in the area. The nearest facility is 30 miles in Vernon and Childress.

In Fiscal Year 2002, a total of \$12 million in direct and guaranteed loans were obligated. Community Facilities loan funds may be used to construct, enlarge, or improve community facilities for health care, public safety, and public services. These loans and grants are made to public entities and non-profit organizations. Examples of eligible projects include rural healthcare clinics, town halls, fire trucks, county safety equipment, jaws of life, early warning systems, community centers, libraries, day care centers, and schools.
