### **USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR THE CITY OF NAZARETH VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**Nazareth, Texas, September 30, 2003**— Bryan Daniel, State Director, Texas USDA Rural Development announces today that the City of Nazareth Volunteer Fire Department received a \$87,000 loan through the agency's Community Facilities Loan program. The effort is part of USDA's Rural Development's national program to help provide rural areas build and enhance essential community facilities.

"USDA Rural Development's Community Facilities program helps rural communities keep pace with the needs of their rising populations," said Daniel. "Rural residents can utilize our programs to help provide essential public services that will enhance the quality of life for all rural residents."

The funds will be used to construct a steel building with five (5) vehicle bays and a basement. The basement will be used as a community storm shelter. The City plans to sell the existing building and move off site so the new building can be built on the existing site. The population of the city is 356, and the service area is roughly 1/3 of Castro County.

In Fiscal Year 2003, a total of \$15.2 million in direct and guaranteed loans were obligated. Community Facilities loan funds may be used to construct, enlarge, or improve community facilities for health care, public safety, and public services. These loans and grants are made to public entities and non-profit organizations. Examples of eligible projects include rural healthcare clinics, town halls, fire trucks, county safety equipment, jaws of life, early warning systems, community centers, libraries, day care centers, and schools.
