USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR THE CITY OF LLANO

Llano, Texas, February 21, 2004— Bryan Daniel, state director, Texas USDA Rural Development announces today that the City of Llano received a \$2,145,000 loan and a \$1,332,000 grant through the agency's Rural Utilities Service Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant program. The effort is part of USDA's national program to help provide rural areas with safe, dependable water and modern sewage systems.

"One of the goals of USDA Rural Development is to provide water and wastewater treatment programs that target public health benefits and provide economic opportunities to America's rural communities," said Daniel. "Rural residents can utilize our programs to help provide essential public services that will enhance their quality of life."

The funds will be used to install a new 16-inch water transmission line connecting the water treatment plant high pressure service pump station to the water storage tanks in north and south Llano. This new installation will convert its service area from a single pressure zone into two pressure zones to better serve areas with elevations above 1,061 feet. The population of the service area is 3,325.

In Fiscal Year 2003, \$64.4 million of loan and grant assistance was infused into 71 projects and 137,451 rural Texas households. USDA Rural Development's water and wastewater program is designed to bring fresh, clean drinking water and sanitary, environmentally sound sewage facilities to rural America's 53 million residents. Loans and grants are available to rural communities with fewer than 10,000 residents. Public bodies, corporations operated on a nonprofit basis, and Indian tribes, that are unable to obtain credit from other sources at reasonable rates and terms, are eligible for assistance.
