USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR CEA FARM COOPERATIVE STEERING COMMITTEE

Del Rio, Texas, April 15, 2004 – Bryan Daniel, Texas USDA Rural Development State Director, announced today \$40,000 in economic development to strengthen rural communities in Texas, as part of the Bush Administration's ongoing commitment to invest and bolster programs for rural America.

CEA Farm Cooperative Steering Committee received a Value-Added Product to Market Development Grant to develop a network of controlled environmental agricultural greenhouses for hydroponic and organic vegetables.

"This grant will bring new economic opportunities and job creation for rural Texans," said Daniel. "CEA Farm Cooperative Steering Committee will give rural residents the opportunity to expand and improve local businesses and economies."

The VAPG program is designed to provide agricultural producers or rural businesses with grant funds to further refine agricultural commodities, increasing their value to consumers. The grants will also provide capital to allow producers to better market their products so that they can better compete in domestic and international markets. Recipients are required to obtain matching funds, which will double the impact of the USDA grants. Funding of individual recipients will be contingent upon meeting the conditions of the grant agreement.
