## **USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR TEXAS HAIR SHEEP PRODUCERS COALITION**

**Sterling City, Texas, April 17, 2004** – Bryan Daniel, Texas USDA Rural Development State Director, announced today \$145,194 in economic development to strengthen rural communities in Texas, as part of the Bush Administration's ongoing commitment to invest and bolster programs for rural America.

Texas Hair Sheep Producers Coalition received a Value-Added Product to Market Development Grant to establish a feasibility study to create premium products to expand hair sheep production in rural Texas.

"This grant will bring new economic opportunities and job creation for rural Texans," said Daniel. "Texas Hair Sheep Producers Coalition will give rural residents the opportunity to expand and improve local businesses and economies."

The VAPG program is designed to provide agricultural producers or rural businesses with grant funds to further refine agricultural commodities, increasing their value to consumers. The grants will also provide capital to allow producers to better market their products so that they can better compete in domestic and international markets. Recipients are required to obtain matching funds, which will double the impact of the USDA grants. Funding of individual recipients will be contingent upon meeting the conditions of the grant agreement.

USDA Rural Development serves as the lead Federal entity for rural development needs and administers financial and technical assistance through its housing programs, business programs, and utilities programs.
