USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR CHALK BLUFF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

WACO, Texas, May 14, 2004 – Bryan Daniel, state director, Texas USDA Rural Development announces that Chalk Bluff Volunteer Fire Department received a \$133,000 loan. USDA Rural Development is charged with assisting rural communities by administering programs targeted to strengthening the economy and infrastructure of rural areas.

“USDA Rural Development’s Community Facilities program helps rural communities keep pace with the needs of their rising populations,” said Daniel. “Rural residents can utilize our programs to help provide essential public services that will enhance the quality of life for all rural residents. This program plays an important role in providing resources to first responders in rural Texas.”

The funds are being used to purchase a new 2005 fire truck. Population served by this project is approximately 4,793.

In Fiscal Year 2003, a total of \$15.2 million in direct and guaranteed loans were obligated. Community Facilities loan funds may be used to construct, enlarge, or improve community facilities for health care, public safety, and public services. These loans and grants are made to public entities and non-profit organizations. Examples of eligible projects include rural healthcare clinics, town halls, fire trucks, county safety equipment, jaws of life, early warning systems, community centers, libraries, day care centers, and schools.
