USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR CITY OF ELGIN

ELGIN, TEXAS, July 29, 2004 – USDA Rural Development, State Director, Bryan Daniel, announced today that the City of Elgin, received a \$4,307,000 Water and Waste Disposal loan through the agency's Community Programs Water and Waste Disposal Loan fund. The effort is part of the USDA's national program to help provide rural areas with safe, dependable water and modern sewage systems.

"One of the goals of USDA Rural Development is to provide water and wastewater treatment programs that target public health benefits and provide economic opportunities to America's rural communities," said Daniel. "Rural residents can utilize our programs to help provide essential public services that will enhance their quality of life."

The loan funds for the City of Elgin will be used to complete Phase I of two phases. The first phase will expand the water treatment plant. Approximately 2,402 users are served by this project.

In Fiscal Year 2003, \$64.4 million of loan and grant assistance was infused into 71 projects and assisted 137,451 rural Texans. USDA Rural Development's water and wastewater program is designed to bring fresh, clean drinking water and sanitary, environmentally sound sewage facilities to rural America's 53 million residents. Loans and grants are available to rural communities with fewer than 10,000 residents. Public bodies, corporations operated on a nonprofit basis, and Indian tribes, that are unable to obtain credit from other sources at reasonable rates and terms, are eligible for assistance.
