## **USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR BRYSON VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE**

**BRYSON, TEXAS**, August 10, 2004 – USDA Rural Development, State Director, Bryan Daniel, announced today that the Bryson Volunteer Emergency Medical Service, received a \$19,400 community facilities loan and grant. USDA Rural Development is charged with assisting rural communities by administering programs targeted to strengthening the economy and infrastructure of rural areas.

“USDA Rural Development’s Community Facilities program helps rural communities keep pace with the needs of their rising populations,” said Daniel. “Rural residents can utilize our programs to help provide essential public services that will enhance the quality of life for all rural residents.”

The funds will be used to purchase an ambulance. Population served by the project is approximately 214.

In Fiscal Year 2003, a total of \$15.2 million in direct and guaranteed loans were obligated. Community Facilities loan funds may be used to construct, enlarge, or improve community facilities for health care, public safety, and public services. These loans and grants are made to public entities and non-profit organizations. Examples of eligible projects include rural healthcare clinics, town halls, fire trucks, county safety equipment, jaws of life, early warning systems, community centers, libraries, day care centers, and schools.
