## **USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR CAMPBELL WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION**

**CAMPBELL, TEXAS, April 13, 2005** – Bryan Daniel, USDA Rural Development State Director, announced today that the Campbell Water Supply Corporation was selected to receive a \$1,782,000 loan and grant. The funds awarded through the agency's Community Programs Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant program will be used to drill a new well, construct an 80,000 gallon ground storage tank, a 75,000 elevated storage tank and a booster pump station. 467 users will be served by this project.

"USDA Rural Development is committed to ensuring rural areas are provided the financial assistance they need to receive adequate, safe and clean water," said Daniel. "The Campbell Water Supply Corporation will be able to meet the needs of a growing community and supply them with a safe supply of water."

USDA Rural Development's water and wastewater program is designed to bring fresh, clean drinking water and sanitary, environmentally sound sewage facilities to rural America's 53 million residents. Loans and grants are available to rural communities with fewer than 10,000 residents. Public bodies, corporations operating on a non-profit basis and Indian tribes that are unable to obtain credit from other sources at reasonable rates and terms, are eligible for assistance.

USDA Rural Development's community programs enhance the quality of life for rural Texans by funding new and improved water and wastewater facilities, providing funds to governmental entities, non-profit organizations and Indian Tribes to enlarge, improve or construct schools, libraries, medical clinics, assisted living centers, public buildings, community centers.

USDA Rural Development was created in 1994 with a mission to use the resources of USDA to help enhance the quality of life for the nation's rural residents.
