USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR CANEY CREEK MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

SARGENT, TEXAS, March 7, 2006-- Bryan Daniel, USDA Rural Development State Director, today announced that the Caney Creek Municipal Utility District has been selected to receive \$4,335,000 through the agency's Community Program Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant Programs. The funding will be used to alleviate health and sanitation issues by completing a sewer collection system to replace septic tanks that do not function properly.

"The USDA Rural Development Water and Waste Disposal Programs target public health benefits and economic opportunities in America's rural communities," said Daniel. "Projects such as this one in the City of Sargent will help make the environment cleaner and protect the public health for local residents."

In Fiscal Year 2005, \$80.7 million of loan and grant assistance was distributed throughout rural Texas to 315,249 households. The USDA Rural Development Water and Waste Disposal Program is designed to bring fresh, clean drinking water and sanitary, environmentally sound sewage facilities to rural America's 53 million residents. Loans and grants are available to rural communities with fewer than 10,000 residents. Public bodies, corporations operating on a non-profit basis, and Indian tribes, that are unable to obtain credit from other sources at reasonable rates and terms, are eligible for assistance.
