USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR CITY OF NAZARETH

NAZARETH, TEXAS, April 3, 2006-- Bryan Daniel, USDA Rural Development State Director, today announced the City of Nazareth has been selected to receive \$235,000 through the agency's Community Programs Water and Waste Disposal Loan Program. The funds will be used to construct a new public water supply well and transmission lines to compensate for additional water usage during the height of agricultural irrigation in the community.

"USDA Rural Development is delighted to assist the City of Nazareth in providing an adequate supply of safe and dependable drinking water for their residents," said Daniel.

In Fiscal Year 2005, \$48.9 million of Water and Waste Disposal Loan assistance was distributed throughout rural Texas. USDA Rural Development Water and Waste Disposal Programs are designed to bring fresh, clean drinking water and sanitary, environmentally sound sewage facilities to rural America's 53 million residents. Loans and grants are available to rural communities with fewer than 10,000 residents. Public bodies, corporations operating on a non-profit basis, and Indian tribes, that are unable to obtain credit from other sources at reasonable rates and terms, are eligible for assistance.

USDA Rural works to ensure that rural citizens can participate fully in the global marketplace, by providing programs that assist rural Americans in building strong economies and to improve their quality of life.
