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USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR GROESBECK ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

GROESBECK, TEXAS, June 9, 2006-- USDA Rural Development State Director, Bryan Daniel, today announced Groesbeck Economic Development Corporation has received a \$150,000 Rural Business Enterprise Grant (RBEG) to construct a concrete entrance road to their industrial park in an effort to entice businesses and create new jobs for the community.

“The injection of funds into the area will be used to construct a new concrete entrance road for a company that plans to build a facility in their Industrial Park,” said Daniel. “I am very pleased that Texas USDA Rural Development is able to assist the Groesbeck Economic Development Corporation.”

In Fiscal Year 2005, Texas USDA Rural Development obligated over \$1.3 million in Rural Business Enterprise Grants. Potential businesses in rural communities interested in the RBEG Program must employ 50 or fewer new employees and have less than \$1 million in gross annual revenues. Public bodies and not-for-profit entities including federally recognized Indian Tribes located in rural areas or in communities below 50,000 in population are eligible for the RBEG Program. Priority is given to applicants from communities of 25,000 or less.
