USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR JIM HOGG WATER CONTROL & IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT #2

HEBBRONVILLE, TEXAS, September 6, 2006-- Bryan Daniel, USDA Rural Development State Director, today announced Jim Hogg Water Control & Improvement District #2 has been selected to receive \$2,515,000 through the USDA Rural Development Community Program Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant Program. The funding will be used complete Phase II of a two phase project designed to make improvements to the existing water system. Phase II will consist of drilling a new water supply well, plant piping, chlorination facility, electrical work and acquisition of a one acre well size at the Jim Hogg WCID #2 located in the City of Hebbbronville.

“The USDA Rural Development Water and Waste Disposal Programs target public health benefits and economic opportunities in America’s rural communities,” said Daniel. “Projects such as this one will help make the environment cleaner and protect the public health for local residents.”

In Fiscal Year 2005, \$80.7 million of loan and grant assistance was distributed throughout rural Texas to 315,249 households. The USDA Rural Development Water and Waste Disposal Program is designed to bring fresh, clean drinking water and sanitary, environmentally sound sewage facilities to rural America’s 53 million residents. Loans and grants are available to rural communities with fewer than 10,000 residents. Public bodies, corporations operating on a non-profit basis, and Indian tribes, that are unable to obtain credit from other sources at reasonable rates and terms, are eligible for assistance.
